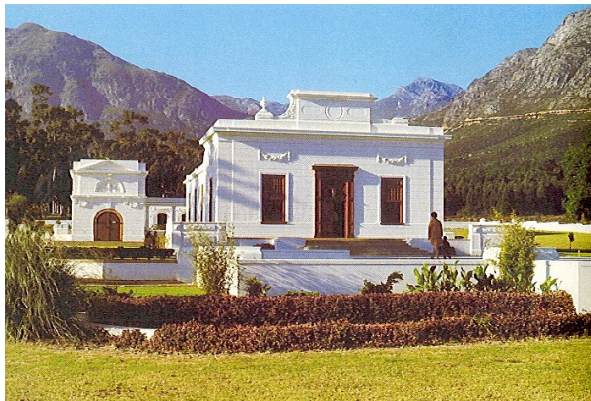

The Huguenot Society of South Africa was established on March 12th, 1958 with the following aims:

- preserving and promoting the heritage and history of the Huguenots in South Africa;
- maintaining the Huguenot Monument and Memorial museum in Franschhoek, Western Cape;
- research into our Huguenot inheritance, especially with regards to its history, and social, political and economic aspects;
- support for genealogical research and the publication of genealogies of South African families of Huguenot descent;
- encouraging the safe-keeping, exhibiting and financing of Huguenot heirlooms and artefacts in the Huguenot Memorial museum in Franschhoek;
- organising Huguenot commemorative festivals; and
- establishing contact with other international Huguenot societies world-wide.

Anyone who subscribes to the aims of the Huguenot Society of South Africa may apply for membership, either renewable annually, or life membership. Since 1963 the Society publishes, in September of each year, the "Huguenot Bulletin" (in English and Afrikaans) with news about the activities of the Society, and articles by members about family history, research and genealogy. Every issue focuses on a specific "focus family" of Huguenot origin. The "Huguenot-Bulletin" is provided free of charge to all subscribed members of the Society.

Other activities of the Society include the publication of books about the Huguenot history, and genealogies of families of Huguenot descent in South Africa. Genealogical research about South African families of Huguenot descent is offered by staff of the Huguenot Memorial museum in Franschhoek

CD's and DVD's about aspects of the Huguenots, their origin and settlement in South Africa, documentary videos, and music of composers and artists of Huguenot descent available at the museum shop of the Huguenot Memorial Museum in Franschhoek, or from the Society (address on front page) or via the website of the Society at <http://www.huguenot.org.za>

The Society undertakes the organization of memorial festivals, such as the Huguenot Tricentenary Festival of 1989 which commemorated the arrival of the Huguenots at the Cape of Good Hope during 1688/1689.

In 2002 the Society hosted the 3rd International Huguenot Conference in Stellenbosch and Franschhoek.

The Annual General meeting of the Society is held annually on the last Saturday of October in Franschhoek, Western Cape, followed by celebrating Reformation Sunday the following day.
